## A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE OPERATIONS OF THE NATIONAL POWER TRANSMISSION GRID TO ENSURE THE QUALITY, RELIABILITY, AND SECURITY OF ELECTRICITY NATIONWIDE

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9136 or the Electric Power Industry Reform Act (EPIRA) provides that it is the policy of the State to ensure the quality, reliability, security, and affordability of the supply of electric power<sup>1</sup> as well as protect the public interest as it is affected by the services of electric utilities;<sup>2</sup>

WHEREAS, the public utility which presently operates and manages the grid is the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) which acts as the system operator of the nationwide electrical transmission system<sup>3</sup> and is mandated by the Constitution to have all its executive and managing officers to be Filipinos;<sup>4</sup>

WHEREAS, the NGCP as system operator is responsible for connection and operational requirements for the introduction of variable energy in the grid,<sup>5</sup> contracting reserves,<sup>6</sup> the timely build of necessary transmission facilities based on the Transmission Development Plan,<sup>7</sup> and faithful operation and maintenance of the

transmission and subtransmission facilities, and other assets which constitute the national grid;<sup>8</sup>

WHEREAS, several hearings by the Senate Energy Committee and the Joint Congressional Energy Commission show serious concerns pertaining to the operations of NGCP which adversely affects the quality, reliability, and security of the supply of electric power, such as failing to address intermittency caused by variable energy resources in the grid thereby causing power outages,<sup>9</sup> failing to fully contract contingency reserves that can control and immediately address any reduction in supply resulting to power outages,<sup>10</sup> and failing to timely construct necessary transmission facilities for additional power supply to be introduced to the grid in order to meet increasing electricity demand;<sup>11</sup>

WHEREAS, the 2020 budget deliberations for the Department of Energy (DOE) and its attached agencies held on 19 November 2019 raised questions<sup>12</sup> on whether or not NGCP complies with the Constitutional mandate for public utilities to have all its executive and managing officers as Filipinos and that NGCP is controlled and managed by Chinese engineers;<sup>13</sup>

WHEREAS, foreign intervention in the operations and management of the national grid is inimical to the interests of the Philippines especially with the possible use of technology to virtually attack the grid and thereby to cause power outages.<sup>14</sup> Hence, other jurisdictions have crafted plans and policies,<sup>15</sup> strategies,<sup>16</sup> and studies<sup>17</sup> for grid security and resiliency.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for Congress to be made aware of the operations of the grid and to ensure accountability on the part of NGCP as it performs its duties and functions as the system operator;
