## AN ACT CONVERTING THE MUNICIPALITY OF CALACA IN THE PROVINCE OF BATANGAS INTO A COMPONENT CITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE CITY OF CALACA

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Located along the western part of Batangas province, the Municipality of Calaca has grown from a sleepy 4<sup>th</sup> class municipality in the 80's into a 1<sup>st</sup> class municipality with annual regular income of Php251.598 million and Php269.155 million at 2000 constant prices in 2017 and 2018, respectively.

Gradually emerging as the center of trade and commerce in the First District of Batangas, the municipality of Calaca has attracted major industries, such as SEM Calaca Power Corporation and Phoenix Petroterminals and Industrial Park Corp, to establish and operate their facilities in the area which has been driving agricultural and industrial development and providing employment opportunities to its residents.

As it seeks to address urbanization needs, enhance tourism potentials, integrate environmental management system and increase agricultural and industrial capacity, the municipality needs to continue towards the path of progress and sustainable growth. This development agenda necessarily requires economic viability which can only be assured by converting the municipality into a component city.


As being proposed in this measure, Calaca's conversion into a component city will provide immediate access to greater resources that would optimize its continuous growth and development.

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# AN ACT

# CONVERTING THE MUNICIPALITY OF CALACA IN THE PROVINCE OF BATANGAS INTO A COMPONENT CITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE CITY OF CALACA

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	ARTICLE I
2	GENERAL PROVISIONS
3	SECTION 1. Title - This Act shall be known as the "Charter of the
4	City of Calaca."
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6	SEC. 2. The City of Calaca – The Municipality of Calaca shall be
7	converted into a component city to be known as the City of Calaca, hereinafter
8	referred to as the City, which shall comprise the present jurisdiction of the
9	Municipality of Calaca, Province of Batangas.
10	The territorial jurisdiction of the City shall be within the present metes
11	and bounds of the Municipality of Calaca.
12	The foregoing provision shall be without prejudice to the resolution by
13	the appropriate agency or forum of existing boundary disputes or cases
14	involving questions of territorial jurisdiction between the City of Calaca and

1 the adjoining local government units: Provided, that, the territorial 2 jurisdiction of the disputed area or areas shall remain with the local 3 government unit, which has existing administrative supervision over said area 4 or areas until the final resolution of the case.

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6 SEC. 3. Corporate Powers of the City – The City constitutes a political body corporate and as such is endowed with the attributes of perpetual 7 succession and possessed of the powers which pertains to a municipal 8 9 corporation to be exercised in conformity with the provision of this Charter. 10 The City shall have the following corporate powers:

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(a) To have a continuous succession in its corporate name;

12 (b) To sue and be sued;

13 (c) To have and use a corporate seal;

14 (d) To acquire, hold and convey real or personal property;

15 (e) To enter into any contracts and/or agreements; and

- (f) To exercise such other powers, prerogatives or authority subject to 16 17 the limitations provided under Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise 18 known as the "Local Government Code of 1991, as amended", this 19 Act or laws.
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21 **SEC. 4.** *General Powers* – The City shall have a common seal and may 22 alter the same at pleasure. Provided, that any change of corporate seal shall be registered with the Department of the Interior and Local Government 23 24 (DILG). It shall exercise the powers to levy taxes, fees and charges; to close 25 and open roads, streets, alleys, parks or squares; to take, purchase, receive, 26 hold, lease, convey and dispose of real and personal property for the general 27 interests of the City; to expropriate or condemn private property for public use; to contract and be contracted with, to sue and be sued; to prosecute and 28 defend to final judgment and execution suits wherein the City is involved or 29 30 interested in; and to exercise all the powers as are granted to corporations or as hereinafter granted. 31

1 SEC. 5. General Welfare Clause of the City – The City shall exercise 2 the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as 3 powers necessary, appropriate or incidental for its efficient and effective 4 governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general 5 welfare.

6 Within its territorial jurisdiction, the City shall ensure and support the 7 preservation and enrichment of its culture, promote health and safety, 8 enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support 9 the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological 10 capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social 11 justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and 12 order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants.

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14 15 **SEC. 6.** *Liability for Damages* – The City and its officials shall not be exempt from liability for death or injury to persons or damage to property.

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17 SEC. 7. Jurisdiction of the City – The jurisdiction of the City, for 18 police purposes only, shall be coextensive with its territorial jurisdiction and 19 for the purpose of protecting and ensuring the purity of the water supply of 20 the City, such police jurisdiction shall also extend over all the territory within 21 the drainage area of such water supply, or within one hundred meters (100 22 m.) of any reservoir, conduit, canal, aqueduct or pumping station used in 23 connection with the city water service.

The city court of the City of Calaca and the city or municipal courts of the adjoining cities and municipalities shall have concurrent jurisdiction to try crimes and misdemeanors committed within the said drainage area or areas within said spaces of one hundred meters (100 m.) of any reservoir, conduit, canal, aqueduct or pumping station used in connection with the City water service delivery.

30 The court first taking jurisdiction of such an offense shall have 31 jurisdiction to try cases to the exclusion of others. The police forces of the

1 municipalities and cities concerned shall have concurrent jurisdiction with 2 the police forces of the City for the maintenance of good order and the 3 enforcement of ordinances throughout said zone, area or space. Any license 4 that may be issued within said zone, area or space shall be granted by the 5 proper authorities of the city or municipality concerned, and the fees arising 6 there from shall accrue to the treasury of the said city or municipality 7 concerned and not to the City.

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**ARTICLE II** 

### **CITY OFFICIALS IN GENERAL**

SEC. 8. The Officials of the City of Calaca - (a) There shall be in the 11 12 City of Calaca: a City Mayor, a City Vice Mayor, Sangguniang Panlungsod 13 members, a secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod, a city treasurer and an 14 assistant city treasurer, a city assessor and an assistant city assessor, a city accountant, a city budget officer, a city planning and development officer, a 15 16 city engineer, a city health officer, a city civil registrar, a city administrator, a city legal officer, a city social welfare and development officer, a city 17 veterinarian and a city general services officer. 18

(b) In addition thereto, the City Mayor may appoint a city environment
and natural resources officer, city architect, a city information officer, a city
cooperatives officer, a city population officer and a city agriculturist;

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- (c) The Sangguniang Panlungsod may:
- 23 (1) Maintain existing offices not mentioned in subsections (a) and (b)
  24 hereof;
- (2) Create such other offices as may be necessary to carry out the
  purposes of the city government; or
- 27 28
- (3) Consolidate the functions of any office with those of another in the interest of efficiency and economy.

(d) Unless otherwise provided herein, heads of departments and offices
shall be appointed by the City Mayor with the concurrence of the majority of
all the Sangguniang Panlungsod members, subject to civil service law, rules

and regulations. The Sangguniang Panlungsod shall act on the appointment
 within fifteen (15) days from the day of its submission, otherwise the same
 shall be deemed confirmed.

4 (e) Elective and appointive city officials shall receive compensation. 5 allowances and other emoluments as may be determined by law or ordinances, subject to the budgetary limitations on personal services 6 prescribed under Title Five, Book II of the Local Government Code of 1991, as 7 amended: Provided, That no increase in the compensation of the City Mayor, 8 9 City Vice Mayor and the Sangguniang Panlungsod member shall take effect 10 until after the expiration of the full term of the local officials approving the 11 increase.

#### ARTICLE III

### THE CITY MAYOR AND CITY VICE MAYOR

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15 SEC. 9. The City Mayor - (a) The City Mayor shall be the chief
16 executive of the City and shall be elected at large by the qualified voters of the
17 City.

18 The City Mayor shall, at the time of the election, be at least twenty-one 19 (21) years of age, a resident of the City for at least one (1) year immediately 20 preceding the day of the election, a qualified registered voter therein and is 21 able to read and write Filipino or any local language or dialect.

22 The City Mayor, who shall hold office for three (3) years, unless sooner removed, and shall not serve for more than three (3) consecutive terms in the 23 24 same position, shall receive a minimum monthly compensation corresponding 25 to Salary Grade thirty (30) as prescribed under Republic Act No. 6758, as amended, otherwise known as the "Compensation and Position Classification 26 Act of 1989", and the implementing guidelines issued pursuant thereto and 27 such other compensation, emoluments and allowances as may be determined 28 by law. 29

(b) The City Mayor, as the Chief Executive of the City Government, shall
 exercise such powers and perform such duties and functions as provided for
 by the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, this Act and other laws.

4 (c) For efficient, effective and economical governance the purpose of
5 which is the general welfare of the City and its inhabitants, the City Mayor
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(i) Determine the guidelines of city policies and be responsible to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* for the program of government;

(1) Exercise general supervision and control over all programs,

projects, services, and activities of the city government and, in this

 (ii) Direct the formulation of the city development plan with the assistance of the city development council and upon approval thereof by the Sangguniang Panlungsod, implement the same;

(iii) Present the program of government and propose policies and
projects for the consideration of the Sangguniang Panlungsod
at the opening of the regular session of the Sangguniang *Panlungsod* every calendar year and as often as may be deemed
necessary as the general welfare of the inhabitants and the
needs of the city government may require;

21(iv)Initiate and propose legislative measures to the Sangguniang22Panlungsod and as often as may be deemed necessary, provide23such information and data needed or requested by said24Sanggunian in the performance of its legislative functions;

(v) Appoint all officials and employees whose salaries and wages
are wholly or mainly paid out of city funds and whose
appointments are not otherwise provided for under the Local
Government Code of 1991, as amended, and this Act, and
those whose appointment the City Mayor may be authorized by
law to appoint;

 (vi) Represent the City in all its business transactions and sign in its behalf all bonds, contracts, obligations, and such other documents upon the authority of the Sangguniang Panlungsod or pursuant to law or ordinance;

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- 5 (vii) Carry out such emergency measures as may be necessary
  6 during and in the aftermath of man-made and natural
  7 disasters and calamities;
- 8 (viii) Determine the time, manner and place of payment of salaries
  9 or wages of the officials and employees of the City, in
  10 accordance with law or ordinance;
- 11(ix)Allocate and assign office space to the City and other officials12and employees who, by law or ordinance, are entitled to such13space in the city hall and other buildings owned or leased by14the city government;
- 15 (x) Ensure that all executive officials and employees of the City 16 faithfully discharge their duties and functions as provided for 17 by law and the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, 18 and cause to be instituted administrative or judicial 19 proceedings against any official or employee of the City who 20 may have committed an offense in the performance of his 21 official duties;
- (xi) Examine the books, records and other documents of all offices,
  officials, agents or employees of the City and, in aid of his
  executive powers and authority, require all national officials
  and employees stationed in or assigned to the City to make
  available such books, records and other documents in their
  custody except those classified by law as confidential;
- (xii) Furnish copies of executive orders issued by the City Mayor to
  the office of the provincial governor within seventy-two (72)
  hours after their issuance;

- 1 (xiii) Visit component barangays of the City at least once every six 2 (6) months to deepen his understanding of problems and 3 conditions, listen and give appropriate counsel to local officials 4 and inhabitants, inform component barangay officials and 5 inhabitants of general laws and ordinances which especially concern them, and otherwise conduct visits and inspections to 6 7 ensure that the governance of the City will improve the quality of life of the inhabitants; 8
  - (xiv) Act on leave applications of officials and employees on the commutation of the monetary value of their leave credits in accordance with law;

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- 12 (xv) Authorize official trips of city officials and employees outside of 13 the City for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days: *Provided*, 14 that trips abroad for a longer period may be authorized in 15 accordance with the Local Government Code of 1991, as 16 amended;
- 17 (xvi) Call upon any national official or employee stationed in or 18 assigned to the City for advise on matters affecting the City and 19 to make recommendations thereon; coordinate with said 20 officials and employees in the formulation and the 21 implementation of plans, programs and projects; and when 22 appropriate, initiate an administrative or judicial action against 23 a national government official or employee who may have committed an offense in the performance of his official duties 24 25 while stationed in or assigned to the City;
- (xvii) Authorize payment for medical care, necessary transportation,
  subsistence, hospital or medical fees of city officials and
  employees who are injured while in the performance of their
  official duties and functions, subject to availability of funds;
- 30 (xviii) Solemnize marriages, any provision of law to the contrary
   31 notwithstanding;

- (xix) Conduct an annual palarong panlungsod which shall feature traditional sports and disciplines included in national and international games, in coordination with the Department of Education (DepEd); and
- (xx) Submit to the provincial governor the following reports: an 5 annual report containing a summary of all matters pertinent to 6 7 the management, administration and development of the City and all information and data relative to its political, social and 8 economic conditions; supplemental reports when unexpected 9 events and situations arise at any time during the year, 10 particularly when man-made or natural disasters or calamities 11 affect the general welfare of the City. 12

(2) Enforce all laws and ordinances relative to the governance of the City and in the exercise of its appropriate powers as well as implement all approved policies, programs, projects, services and activities of the City and in addition to the foregoing, shall:

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 (i) Ensure that the acts of the City's component barangays and of its officials and employees are within the scope of their prescribed powers, duties and functions;

- (ii) Call conventions, conferences, seminars or meetings of elective or appointive officials of the City, including provincial and national officials and employees stationed in or assigned to the City, at such time and place and on such subject he may deem important for the promotion of the general welfare of the local government unit and its inhabitants;
- (iii) Issue such executive orders for the faithful and appropriate enforcement and execution of laws and ordinances;
- (iv) Be entitled to carry the necessary firearms within his or her
  territorial jurisdiction;
  - (v) Act as the deputized representative of the National Police Commission, formulate the peace and order plan of the City,

upon its approval, implement the same; and as such, exercise general and operational control and supervision over the police forces in the City in accordance with Republic Act No. 6975, otherwise known as the "Department of the Interior and Local Government Act of 1990"; and,

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(vi) Call upon the appropriate law enforcement agencies to suppress disorder, riot, lawless violence, rebellion or sedition, or apprehend violators of the law when public interest so requires and the city police forces are inadequate to cope with the situation or the violators.

(3) Initiate and maximize the generation of resources and
revenues and apply the same to the implementation of development
plans, program objectives and priorities, particularly the resources and
revenues programmed for agro-industrial development and countryside
growth and progress, and relative thereto, shall:

- (i) Require each head of an office or department to prepare and
  submit an estimate of appropriations for the ensuing calendar
  year, in accordance with the budget preparation process
  enshrined under Republic Act No. 7160, as as amended,
  otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991";
- (ii) Prepare and submit to the Sanggunian for approval the
  executive and supplemental budgets of the City for the ensuing
  calendar year in the manner provided for under the Local
  Government Code of 1991, as amended;
- (iii) Ensure that all taxes and other revenues of the City are
  collected and that city funds are applied to the payment of
  expenses and settlement of obligations of the City, in
  accordance with law or ordinance;
- (iv) Issue licenses and permits and suspend or revoke the same for
  any violation of the conditions upon which said licenses or
  permits had been issued pursuant to law or ordinance;

- (v) Issue permits without need of approval therefore from any national agency, for the holding of activities for any charitable or welfare purpose, excluding prohibited games of chance or shows contrary to law, public policy and public morals;
- 5 (vi) Require owners of illegally constructed houses, buildings or 6 other structures to obtain the necessary permits, subject to 7 such fines and penalties as may be imposed by law or 8 ordinance, or to make necessary changes in the construction 9 of the same when said construction violates any law or 10 ordinance, or to order the demolition or removal of said house, 11 building or structure within the period prescribed by law or 12 ordinance;

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- (vii)Adopt adequate measures to safeguard and conserve land, mineral, forest, marine and other resources of the City;
- (viii) Provide efficient and effective property and supply
  management in the City; and protect the funds, credits, rights
  and other properties of the City; and
- 18 (ix) Institute or cause to be instituted administrative or judicial
  19 proceedings for violation of ordinances in the collection of
  20 taxes, fees or charges, and for the recovery of funds and
  21 property; and cause the City to be defended against all suits to
  22 ensure that its interests, resources and rights shall be
  23 adequately protected.
- 24 (4) Ensure the delivery of basic services and the provision of25 adequate facilities and, in addition thereto, shall:
- (i) Ensure that the construction and repair of roads and highways
  funded by the national government shall be, as far as
  practicable, carried out in a spatially contiguous manner and
  in coordination with the construction and repair of the roads
  and bridges of the City and of the province; and,

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(ii) Coordinate the implementation of technical services, including public works and infrastructure programs, rendered by national offices and provincial office.

(5) Exercise such other powers and perform such other duties and functions as provided for under Republic Act No. 7160, as amended, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, and those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

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(d) The City Mayor shall hold office in the City Hall.

10 SEC. 10. The City Vice Mayor - (a) There shall be a City Vice Mayor who shall be elected in the same manner as the City Mayor and shall at the 11 12 time of the election possess the same qualifications as the City Mayor. The 13 City Vice Mayor shall hold office for three (3) years, unless sooner removed, 14 and shall receive a monthly compensation corresponding to salary grade 15 twenty-six (26) as prescribed under Republic Act No. 6758, otherwise known as the "Compensation and Position Classification Act of 1989", and the 16 implementing guidelines issued pursuant thereto, and such other 17 18 compensation, emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

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(b) The City Vice Mayor shall exercise the following duties:

- 20 (1) Act as presiding officer of the Sangguniang Panlungsod and sign all warrants drawn on the City Treasury for all expenditures 21 22 appropriated for the operation of the Sangguniang Panlungsod;
- (2) Subject to civil service law, rules and regulations, appoint all 23 officials and employees including the secretary of the 24 25 Sangguniang Panlungsod, except those whose manner of appointment is specifically provided for under the Local 26 Government Code of 1991, as amended; 27
- (3) Assume the office of the City Mayor for the unexpired term of the 28 29 latter in the event of permanent vacancy as provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended; 30

1	(4) Exercise the powers and perform the duties and functions of the
2	City Mayor in cases of temporary vacancy as provided for under
3	the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended; and
4	(5) Perform such other duties and functions, and exercise such other
5	powers as provided under the Local Government Code of 1991, as
6	amended, and those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.
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8	ARTICLE IV
9	THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD
10	SEC. 11. Composition – (a) The Sangguniang Panlungsod, the
11	legislative body of the City, shall be composed of the City Vice Mayor as the
12	presiding officer, ten (10) regular Sanggunian members, the President of the
13	city chapter of the Liga ng mga Barangay, the President of the Panlungsod na
14	Pederasyon ng mga Sangguniang Kabataan and the three (3) sectoral
15	representatives, who shall come from the following sectors, as members: one
16	(1) from the women sector; and, as shall be determined by the Sangguniang
17	Panlungsod within ninety (90) days prior to the holding of the local elections;
18	one (1) from the agricultural or industrial workers sector; and one (1) from the
19	other sectors, including the urban poor, indigenous cultural communities or
20	persons with disabilities (PWDs).
21	(b) The regular members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod and the
22	sectoral representatives shall be elected in the manner as may be
23	provided for by law.
24	(c) The members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall receive a
25	minimum monthly compensation corresponding to Salary Grade
26	Twenty Five (SG-25) as prescribed under the "Compensation and
27	Position Classification Act of 1989", as amended, and the
28	implementing guidelines issued pursuant thereto.
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30	Sec. 12. Powers, Duties, Functions and Compensation - (a) The
31	Sangguniang Panlungsod, as the legislative body of the City, shall enact
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ordinances, approve resolutions and appropriate funds for the general welfare
of the City and its inhabitants pursuant to Section 16 of the Local Government
Code of 1991, as amended, and in the proper exercise of the corporate powers
of the City as provided for under Section 22 of the Local Government Code,
as amended, and shall:

6 (1) Approve ordinances and pass resolutions necessary for an 7 efficient and effective city government and relative hereto shall:

- 8 i. Review all ordinances approved by the Sangguniang Barangay 9 and executive orders issued by the Punong Barangay to 10 determine whether these are within the scope of the 11 prescribed powers of the Sangguniang Barangay and of the 12 Punong Barangay;
- ii. Maintain peace and order by enacting measures to prevent
  and suppress lawlessness, disorder, riot, violence, rebellion or
  sedition and impose penalties for the violation of said
  ordinances;
- iii. Approve ordinances imposing a fine not exceeding Five
  thousand pesos (P5,000) or an imprisonment for a period not
  exceeding one (1) year, or both at the discretion of the court,
  for violation of a city ordinance;
- iv. Adopt measures to protect the inhabitants of the City from the
  harmful effects of man-made or natural disasters and
  calamities, and to provide relief services and assistance for
  victims during and in the aftermath of said disasters or
  calamities and in their return to productive livelihood
  following said events;
- v. Enact ordinances intended to prevent, suppress and impose
  appropriate penalties for habitual drunkenness in public
  places, vagrancy, mendicancy, prostitution, establishment
  and maintenance of houses of ill-repute, gambling and other
  prohibited games of chance, fraudulent devices and ways to

obtain money or property, drug addiction, maintenance of drug dens, drug pushing, juvenile delinquency, the printing, distribution or exhibition of obscene or pornographic materials or publications, and such other activities inimical to the welfare and morals of the inhabitants of the City;

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- vi. Protect the environment. To this end, it may set aside, at least, ten percent (10%) of its development funds for the purpose of maintaining and enhancing the ecological balance of the City. It may also impose appropriate penalties for acts which endanger the environment, such as dynamite fishing and other forms of destructive fishing, illegal logging, smuggling of logs, smuggling of natural resources products and of endangered species of flora and fauna, slash-and-burn farming and such other activities which result in pollution, acceleration of siltation of rivers and lakes or of ecological imbalance;
- vii. Subject to the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991 and the pertinent laws, determine the powers and duties of officials and employees of the City;
- viii. Consistent with the Salary Standardization Law, determine
  the positions and the salaries, wages, allowances and other
  emoluments and benefits of officials and employees paid
  wholly or mainly from city funds and provide for expenditures
  necessary for the proper conduct of programs, projects,
  services and activities of the city government;
- ix. Authorize the payment of compensation to a qualified person not in the government service who fills up a temporary vacancy or grant *honorarium* to any qualified official or employee designated to fill a temporary vacancy in a concurrent capacity at the rate authorized by law;

x. Provide a mechanism and the appropriate funds therefore, to ensure the safety and protection of all city government property, public documents, or records such as those relating to property inventory, land ownership, record of births, marriages, deaths, assessments, taxation, accounts, business permits and such other records and documents of public interest in the offices and departments of the city government;

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- xi. When the finances of the city government allow, provide for additional allowances and other benefits to judges, prosecutors, public elementary and high school teachers, and other national government officials stationed in or assigned to the City;
- xii. Provide legal assistance to barangay officials who, in the
  performance of their official duties or on the occasion thereof,
  have to initiate judicial proceedings or defend themselves
  against legal actions; and
- 17xiii. Provide for group insurance or additional insurance coverage18for all barangay officials, including members of barangay19tanod brigades and other service units, with public or private20insurance companies, when the finances of the city21government allows said coverage.

(2) Generate and maximize the use of resources and revenues for
the development plans, program objectives and priorities of the City, as
provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended,
with particular attention to agro-industrial development and city-wide
growth and progress, and relative thereto, shall:

i. Approve the annual and supplemental budgets of the city
government and appropriate funds for specific programs,
projects, services and activities of the City, or for other
purposes not contrary to law in order to promote the general
welfare of the City and its inhabitants;

 ii. Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and applicable laws and upon the majority vote of all the members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, enact ordinance levying taxes, fees and charges, prescribing the rates thereof for general and specific purposes and granting tax exemptions, incentives or reliefs;

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- iii. Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and upon the majority vote of all the members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, authorize the City Mayor to negotiate and contract loans and other forms of indebtedness;
- 12iv. Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government13Code of 1991, as amended, and applicable laws and upon the14majority vote of all the members of the Sangguniang15Panlungsod, enact ordinances authorizing the floating of16bonds or other instruments of indebtedness, for the purpose17of raising funds to finance development projects;
- v. Appropriate funds for the construction and maintenance or
  the rental of buildings for the use of the City; and, upon the
  majority vote of all the members of the Sangguniang *Panlungsod*, authorize the City Mayor to lease to private
  parties such public buildings held in a proprietary capacity,
  subject to existing laws, rules and regulations;
  - vi. Prescribe reasonable limits and restraints on the use of property within the jurisdiction of the City;

vii. Adopt a comprehensive land use plan for the City. Provided,
that, the formulation, adoption or modification of said plan
shall be in coordination within the approved provincial
comprehensive land use plan;

viii. Reclassify lands within the jurisdiction of the City subject to the pertinent provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;

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- ix. Enact integrated zoning ordinance in consonance with the approved comprehensive land use plan, subject to existing laws, rules and regulations; establish fire limits or zones, particularly in populous centers, and regulate the construction, repair or modification of buildings within said fire limits or zones in accordance with the provisions of the Fire Code of the Philippines;
- x. Subject to national law, process and approve subdivision 11 plans for residential, commercial or industrial purposes and 12 13 other development purposes, and to collect processing fees 14 and other charges, the proceeds of which shall accrue entirely 15 to the City: Provided, however, that where approval of a 16 national agency or office is required, said approval shall not 17 be withheld for more than thirty (30) days from receipt of the application. Failure to act on the application within the period 18 stated above shall be deemed as approval thereof; 19
- 20 xi. Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government 21 Code of 1991, as amended, grant the exclusive privilege of 22 constructing fish corrals or fish pens, or the taking or 23 catching of bangus fry, prawn fry or kawag-kawag, or fry of 24 any species of fish within the city waters;
- 25 xii. With the concurrence of at least two-thirds (2/3) of all the 26 members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, grant tax 27 exemptions, incentives or reliefs to entities engaged in 28 community growth-inducing industries, subject to the 29 provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991, as 30 amended;

1 xiii. Grant loans or provides grants to other local government units 2 or to national, provincial and city charitable, benevolent or 3 educational institutions: Provided, that said institutions are 4 operated and maintained within the City; 5 xiv. Regulate the numbering of residential, commercial and other 6 buildings; and 7 xv. Regulate the inspection, weighing and measuring of articles 8 of commerce. 9 (3) Subject to the provisions of the Local Government Code of 10 1991, as amended, enact ordinances granting franchises and authorizing the issuance of permits or licenses, upon such conditions 11 12 and for such purposes intended to promote the general welfare of the 13 inhabitants of the City and pursuant to this legislative authority, shall: 14 i. Fix and impose reasonable fees and charges for all services rendered by the city government to private persons or entities; 15 ii. Regulate or fix license fees for any business or practice of 16 profession within the City and the conditions under which the 17 18 license for said business or practice of profession may be revoked and enact ordinances levying taxes thereon; 19 20 iii. Provide for and set the terms and conditions under which 21 public utilities owned by the City shall be operated by the city 22 government, and prescribe the conditions under which the 23 same may be leased to private persons or entities, preferably 24 cooperatives; 25 iv. Regulate the display of and fix the license fees for signs, signboards or billboards at the place or places where the 26 27 profession or business advertised thereby is, in whole or in 28 part, conducted; 29 v. Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, authorize and license the establishment, operation and maintenance of 30 cockpits, and regulate cockfighting and commercial breeding 31

3	vi. Su	bject to the guidelines prescribed by the Department of
4	Tra	ansportation (DOTr), regulate the operation of tricycles and

11	wh	arves, markets or slaughterhouses; or undertake such
12	oth	ner activities within the City as may be allowed by existing
13	lav	vs. <i>Provided</i> , That, cooperatives shall be given preference in
14	the	e grant of such a franchise.
15	(4) Reg	gulate activities relative to the use of land, buildings and
16	structures w	within the City in order to promote the general welfare and
17	for said pur	pose, shall:
18	i. De	clare, prevent or abate any nuisance;
19	ii. Wi	th the concurrence of the majority of the members of the
20	Sa	ngguniang Panlungsod, a quorum being present, deny the
21	en	try of legalized gambling by ordinance into any part of the
22	Cit	ty or regulate its location in the City;
23	iii. Re	quire that buildings and the premises thereof and any land
24	wit	thin the City be kept and maintained in a sanitary
25	COI	ndition; impose penalties for any violation thereof; or upon
26	fai	lure to comply with said requirement, have the work done
27	at	the expense of the owner, administrator or tenant
28	COI	ncerned require the filling up of any land or premises to a
29	gra	ade necessary for proper sanitation;
30	iv. Re	gulate the disposal of clinical and other wastes from
31	ho	spitals, clinics and other similar establishments;

v. Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of cafes, restaurants, beerhouses, hotels, motels, inns, pension houses, lodging houses and other similar establishments, including tourist guides and transports;

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- vi. Regulate the sale, giving away or dispensing of any intoxicating malt, *vino*, mixed or fermented liquors at any retail outlets;
- vii. Regulate the establishment and provide for the inspection of steam boilers or any heating device in buildings and the storage of inflammable and highly combustible materials within the City;
- viii. Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of any entertainment or amusement facilities, including the theatrical performances, circuses, billiard halls, public dancing schools, public dance halls, sauna baths, massage parlors and other places for entertainment or amusement; regulate such other events or activities for amusement or entertainment, particularly those which tend to disturb the community or annoy the inhabitants, or require the suspension or suppression of the same; or prohibit certain forms of amusement or entertainment in order to protect the social and moral welfare of the community;
  - ix. Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of funeral parlors and the burial or cremation of the dead, subject to existing laws, rules and regulations; and
  - x. Provide for the impounding of stray animals; regulate the keeping of animals in homes or as part of a business, and the slaughter, sale or disposition of the same; and adopt measures to prevent and penalize cruelty to animals.

(5) Approve ordinances which shall ensure the efficient and effective delivery of the basic services and facilities as provided for under

the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and in addition to 1 2 said services and facilities, shall: 3 i. Provide for the establishment, maintenance, protection and 4 conservation of communal forest and watersheds, tree parks, 5 greenbelts, mangroves and other similar forest development 6 projects; 7 ii. Establish markets, slaughterhouses or animal corrals and 8 authorize the operation thereof by the city government; and 9 regulate the construction and operation of private markets, 10 talipapas or other similar buildings and structures; 11 iii. Authorize the establishment, maintenance and operation by 12 the city government of ferries, wharves, and other structures 13 intended to accelerate productivity related to marine and 14 seashore or offshore activities in the preservation thereof; iv. Regulate the preparation and sale of meat, poultry, fish, 15 vegetables, fruits, fresh dairy products, and other foodstuffs 16 17 for public consumption; 18 v. Regulate the use of streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks, bridges, parks and other public places and approve the 19 20 construction, improvement, repair and maintenance of the same; establish bus and vehicle stops and terminals or 21 regulate the use of the same by privately-owned vehicles 22 which serve the public; regulate garages and operation of 23 24 conveyances for hire; designate stands to be occupied by public vehicles when not in use; regulate the putting up of 25 signs, signposts, awnings and awning posts on the streets; 26 and provide for the lighting, cleaning and sprinkling of streets 27 and public places; 28 vi. Regulate traffic on all streets and bridges; prohibit 29 encroachments or obstacles thereon and, when necessary in 30

the interest of public welfare, authorize the removal of encroachments and illegal constructions in public places;

vii. Subject to existing laws, establish and provide for the maintenance, repair and operation of an efficient waterworks system to supply water for the City's inhabitants and to purify the source of the water supply; regulate the construction, maintenance, repair and use of hydrants, pumps, cisterns and reservoirs; protect the purity and quantity of the water supply of the City and, for this purpose, extend the coverage of appropriate ordinances over all territories within the drainage area of said water supply and within one hundred meters (100 m.) of the reservoir, canal, conduit, aqueduct, pumping station or watershed used in connection with the water service; and regulate the consumption, use or wastage of water and fix and collect charges therefore;

viii. Regulate the drilling and excavation of the ground for the laying of water, gas, sewer, and other pipes and the construction, repair and maintenance of public drains, sewers, cesspools, tunnels and similar structures; regulate the placing of poles and the use of crosswalks, curbs and gutters; adopt measures to ensure public safety against open canals, manholes, live wires and other similar hazards to life and property; and regulate the construction and use of private water closets, privies and other similar structures in buildings and homes;

ix. Regulate the placing, stringing, attaching, installing, repair and construction of all gas mains, electric telegraph and telephone wires, conduits, meters and other apparatus; and provide for the correction, condemnation or removal of the same when found to be dangerous to the welfare of the inhabitants;

- 1 x. Subject to the availability of funds and the existing laws, rules 2 and regulations, establish and provide for the operation of 3 vocational and technical schools and similar post-secondary 4 institutions and, with the Technical Education and Skills 5 Development Authority (TESDA), as the case may be, and subject to existing laws on tuition fees, fix and collect 6 7 reasonable tuition fees and other school charges in educational institutions supported by the city government; 8
  - xi. Establish a scholarship fund for poor but deserving students in schools located within its jurisdiction or for students residing within the City;
- 12xii. Approve measures and adopt quarantine regulations to13prevent the introduction and spread of diseases;

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- 14xiii. Provide for an efficient and effective system of solid waste and15garbage collection and disposal; prohibit littering and the16placing or throwing of garbage, refuse and other filth and17wastes;
- 18xiv. Provide for the care of persons with disabilities (PWDs),19paupers, the elderly, the sick, persons of unsound mind,20abandoned minors, juvenile delinquents, drug dependents,21abused children and the youth below eighteen (18) years of22age; and subject to availability of funds, establish and provide23for the operation of centers and facilities for the said needy24and disadvantaged persons;
  - xv. Establish and provide for the maintenance and improvement of jails and detention centers, institute a sound jail management program, and appropriate funds for the subsistence of detainees and convicted prisoners in the City;
- xvi. Establish a city council whose purpose is the promotion of
  culture and the arts, coordinate with government agencies
  and non-governmental organizations and, subject to the

1	availability of funds, appropriate funds for the support and
2	development of the same; and
3	xvii. Establish a city council for the elderly and senior citizens
4	which shall formulate policies and adopt measures mutually
5	beneficial to the elderly and to the community; provide
6	incentives for nongovernmental agencies and entities and,
7	subject to the availability of funds, appropriate funds to
8	support programs and projects for the benefit of the elderly.
9	(6) Perform such other duties and functions, and exercise such
10	other powers as provided for under Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise
11	known as the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and those
12	that are prescribed by law or ordinance.
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14	ARTICLE V
15	PROCESS OF LEGISLATION
16	SEC. 13. Internal Rules of Procedure – (a) On the first regular
17	session following the election of its members and within ninety (90) days
18	thereafter, the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall adopt or update its existing
19	rules of procedure.
20	(b) The rules of procedure shall provide for the following:
21	(1) The organization of the <i>Sanggunian</i> and the election of its officers
22	as well as the creation of standing committees which shall
23	include, but shall not be limited to, the committees on
24	Appropriations, Revenues, Engineering and Public Works,
25	Education and Health, Women and Family, Human Rights, Youth
26	and Sports Development, Environmental Protection, Peace and
27	Order and Traffic, and Cooperatives; the general jurisdiction of
28	each committee; and the election of the chairman and members
29	of each committee;
30	(2) The order and calendar of business for each session;
31	(3) The legislative process;

- (4) The parliamentary procedures which include the conduct of members during sessions;
- (5) The discipline of members for disorderly behavior and absences without justifiable cause for four (4) consecutive sessions for which they may be censured, reprimanded or excluded from the session, suspended for not more than sixty (60) days or expelled: *Provided*, That the penalty of suspension or expulsion shall require the concurrence of at least two-thirds (2/3) vote of all the Sanggunian members: *Provided*, further, that a member convicted by final judgment to imprisonment of at least one (1) year for any crime involving moral turpitude shall be automatically expelled from the Sanggunian; and

(6) Such other rules as the Sanggunian may adopt.

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SEC. 14. Full Disclosure of Financial and Business Interests of 15 16 Sangguniang Panlungsod Members - (a) Every Sangguniang Panlungsod 17 member shall, upon assumption to office, make a full disclosure of his 18 business and financial interests. Such disclosure shall also include a 19 professional relationship or any relation by affinity or consanguinity within 20 the fourth civil degree, which he may have with any person, firm or entity 21 affected by any ordinance or resolution under consideration by the Sanggunian of which he or she is a member, which relationship may result in 22 23 conflict of interests. Such relationship shall include:

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- (1) Ownership of stock or capital, or investment in the entity or firm to which the ordinance or resolution may apply; and
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- (2) Contracts or agreements with any person or entity which the ordinance or resolution under consideration may affect.

In the absence of a specific constitutional or statutory provision applicable to this situation, "conflict of interest" refers to a situation where it may be reasonably deduced that a member of a *Sanggunian* may not act in the public interest due to some private, pecuniary or other personal considerations that may tend to affect the exercise of judgment to the
 prejudice of the service or the public.

3 (b) The disclosure required under this Act shall be made in writing and
4 submitted to the secretary of the *Sanggunian* or the secretary of the concerned
5 committee. The disclosure shall, in all cases, form part of the record of the
6 proceedings and shall be made in the following manner:

- (1) Disclosure shall be made before the member participates in the deliberations on the ordinance or resolution under consideration: *Provided*, that if the member did not participate during the deliberations, the disclosure shall be made before voting on the ordinance or resolution on second and third readings; and
- (2) Disclosure shall be made when a member takes a position or makes a privilege speech on a matter that may affect the business interest, financial connection or professional relationship described herein.
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16 SEC. 15. Sessions – (a) On the first day of the session immediately 17 following the election of its members, the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall, by 18 resolution, fix the day, time and place of its sessions. The minimum number 19 of regular sessions shall be once a week for the Sangguniang Panlungsod and 20 twice a month for the Sangguniang Barangay.

(b) When the public interest so demands, special sessions may be called
by the City Mayor or by a majority of the members of the Sanggunian.

(c) All Sanggunian sessions shall be open to the public unless a closeddoor session is ordered by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
present, there being a quorum, in the public interest or for reasons of security,
decency or morality. No two (2) sessions, regular or special, may be held in a
single day.

(d) In the case of special sessions of the Sanggunian, a written notice
to the members shall be served personally at the members' usual place of
residence at least twenty-four (24) hours before the special session is held.

1 Unless otherwise concurred in by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the 2 Sanggunian members present, there being a quorum, no other matters may 3 be considered at a special session except those stated in the notice.

4 (e) The Sanggunian Panlungsod shall keep a journal and record of its
5 proceedings which may be published upon resolution of the majority of its
6 members.

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8 SEC. 16. Quorum – (a) A majority of all the members of the Sanggunian 9 who have been elected and qualified shall constitute a quorum to transact 10 official business. Should a question of quorum be raised during a session, 11 the presiding officer shall immediately proceed to call the roll of the members 12 and thereafter announce the results.

(b) Where there is no quorum, the presiding officer may declare a recess until such time as a quorum is constituted, or a majority of the members present may adjourn from day to day and may compel the immediate attendance of any member absent without justifiable cause by designating a member of the *Sanggunian*, to be assisted by a member or members of the police force assigned in the territorial jurisdiction of the City of Calaca, to arrest the absent member and present him at the session.

(c) If there is still no quorum despite the enforcement of the immediately
preceding subsection, no business shall be transacted. The presiding officer,
upon proper motion duly approved by the members present, shall then
declare the session adjourned for lack of quorum.

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SEC. 17. Approval of Ordinances – (a) Every ordinance enacted by the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall be presented to the City Mayor. If the City Mayor approves the same, he or she shall affix his or her signature on each and every page thereof; otherwise, the ordinance shall be vetoed and return the same with statements on the objections to the Sanggunian, which may proceed to reconsider the same. The Sanggunian may override the veto of the City Mayor by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all its members, thereby making the
 ordinance or resolution effective for all legal intents and purposes.

3 (b) The veto shall be communicated by the City Mayor to the 4 Sanggunian within ten (10) days; otherwise, the ordinance shall be deemed 5 approved as if it had been signed.

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**SEC. 18.** Veto Power of the City Mayor – (a) the City Mayor may veto any ordinance of the Sangguniang Panlungsod on the ground that it is ultra vires or prejudicial to the public welfare, stating the reasons thereof in writing.

10 (b) The City Mayor shall have the power to veto any particular item or items of an appropriations ordinance, an ordinance or resolution adopting a 11 12 local development plan and public investment program or an ordinance 13 directing the payment of money or creating liability. In such case, the veto 14 shall not affect the item or items which are not objected to. The vetoed item 15 or items shall not take effect unless the Sangguniang Panlungsod overrides 16 the veto in the manner herein provided; otherwise, the item or items in the 17 appropriations ordinance of the previous year corresponding to those vetoed, 18 if any, shall be deemed re-enacted.

(c) The City Mayor may veto an ordinance or resolution only once. The
Sanggunian may override the veto of the City Mayor by two-thirds (2/3) vote
of all its members, thereby making the ordinance effective even without the
approval of the City Mayor.

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SEC. 19. Review of City Ordinances by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan – (a) Within three (3) days after approval, the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall forward to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for review, copies of approved ordinances and the resolutions approving the local development plans and public investment programs formulated by the local development councils.

30 (b) Within thirty (30) days after receipt of copies of such ordinances and
31 resolutions, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan shall examine the documents or

1 transmit them to the provincial attorney or the provincial prosecutor for 2 prompt examination. The provincial attorney or the provincial prosecutor 3 shall, within a period of ten (10) days from receipt of the documents, inform 4 the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in writing of his comments or 5 recommendations, which may be considered by the Sangguniang 6 Panlalawigan in making its decision.

(c) If the Sangguniang Panlalawigan finds that such an ordinance or
resolution is beyond the power conferred upon the Sangguniang Panlungsod
concerned, it shall declare such ordinance or resolution invalid in whole or in
part. The Sangguniang Panlalawigan shall enter its action in the minutes and
shall advise the corresponding city authorities of the action it has taken.

(d) If no action has been taken by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan within
thirty (30) days after submission of such an ordinance or resolution, the same
shall be presumed consistent with law and therefore valid.

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16 SEC. 20. Review of Barangay Ordinances by the Sangguniang 17 Panlungsod – (a) Within ten (10) days after its enactment, the Sangguniang 18 Barangay shall furnish copies of all barangay ordinances to the Sangguniang 19 Panlungsod for review as to whether the ordinance is consistent with law or 20 city ordinances.

(b) If the Sangguniang Panlungsod fails to take action on barangay
ordinances within thirty (30) days from receipt thereof, the same shall be
deemed approved.

(c) If the Sangguniang Panlungsod finds the barangay ordinances
inconsistent with law or city ordinances, the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall,
within thirty (30) days from receipt thereof, return the same with its
comments and recommendations to the Sangguniang Barangay concerned for
adjustment, amendment or modification; in which case, the effectivity of the
barangay ordinance is suspended until such time as the revision called for is
effected.

1 SEC. 21. Enforcement of Disapproved Ordinances or Resolutions – 2 Any attempt to enforce any ordinance or any resolution approving the local 3 development plan and public investment program, after the disapproval 4 thereof, shall be sufficient ground for the suspension or dismissal of the 5 official or employee concerned.

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7 SEC. 22. Effectivity of Ordinances or Resolutions – (a) Unless 8 otherwise stated in the ordinance or the resolution approving the local 9 development plan and public investment program, the same shall take effect 10 after ten (10) days from the date a copy thereof is posted in a bulletin board 11 at the entrance of the City Hall of Calaca, and in at least two (2) other 12 conspicuous places in the City of Calaca not later than five (5) days after 13 approval thereof.

(b) The secretary of the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall cause the posting
of an ordinance or resolution in the bulletin board at the entrance of the City
Hall, and in at least two (2) conspicuous places in the City not later than five
(5) days after approval thereof.

18 The text of the ordinance or resolution shall be disseminated and posted 19 in Filipino or English and in the language or dialect understood by the 20 majority of the people in the City and the secretary of the *Sangguniang* 21 *Panlungsod* shall record such fact in a book kept for the purpose, stating the 22 dates of approval and posting.

(c) Ordinances with penal sanctions shall be posted at prominent places
in the City Hall, for a minimum period of three (3) consecutive weeks. Such
ordinances shall also be published in a newspaper of general circulation
within the City.

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1	ARTICLE VI
2	DISQUALIFICATIONS AND SUCCESSION FOR ELECTIVE CITY
3	OFFICIALS
4	SEC. 23. Disqualifications for Elective City Officials – The following
5	persons are disqualified from running for any elective position in the City:
6	(a) Those sentenced by final judgment for an offense involving moral
7	turpitude or an offense punishable by one (1) year or more of
8	imprisonment within two (2) years after serving sentence;
9	(b) Those removed from office as a result of an administrative case;
10	(c) Those convicted by final judgment for violating the oath of allegiance
11	to the Republic of the Philippines;
12	(d) Those with dual citizenship;
13	(e) Fugitives from justice in criminal or nonpolitical cases here and
14	abroad;
15	(f) Permanent residents in a foreign country or those who have
16	acquired the right to reside abroad and continue to avail of the same
17	right after the effectivity of the Local Government Code of 1991, as
18	amended; and
19	(g) The insane or feeble-minded.
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21	SEC. 24. Permanent Vacancy in the Offices of the City Mayor and
22	City Vice Mayor - (a) If a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of the City
23	Mayor, the City Vice Mayor shall become the City Mayor. If a permanent
24	vacancy occurs in the office of the City Vice Mayor, the highest ranking
25	Sangguniang Panlungsod member or, in case of the latter's permanent
26	incapacity, the second highest ranking Sangguniang Panlungsod member
27	shall become the City Mayor or City Vice Mayor, as the case may be.
28	Subsequent vacancies in the said offices shall be filled automatically by the
29	other Sanggunian members according to their ranking as defined under the
30	Local Government Code of 1991, as amended.

- (b) If a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of the Punong Barangay, the highest ranking Sangguniang Barangay member or, in case of his or her incapacity, the second highest Sanggunian member shall become the Punong Barangay.
- (c) A tie between or among the highest ranking sangguniang panlungsod members shall be resolved by drawing of lots.
  - (d) The successors, as defined herein, shall serve only the unexpired terms of their predecessors.
- (e) For purposes of this Act, a permanent vacancy arises when an elective local official fills in a higher vacant office, refuses to assume office, fails to qualify, dies, is removed from office, voluntarily resigns or is otherwise permanently incapacitated to discharge the functions of his office.
- (f) For purposes of succession as provided in this Act, ranking in the Sanggunian shall be determined on the basis of the proportion of votes obtained by each winning candidate to the total number of registered voters in the City in the immediately preceding local election.
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20 SEC. 25. Permanent Vacancies in the Sangguniang Panlungsod – 21 Permanent vacancies in the Sangguniang Panlungsod where automatic 22 succession as provided above does not apply shall be filled by appointments 23 in the following manner:

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(1) The provincial governor shall make the aforesaid appointments;

(2) Only the nominee of the political party under which the Sanggunian
member concerned had been elected and whose elevation to the
position next higher in rank created the last vacancy in the
Sanggunian shall be appointed in the manner provided herein. The
appointee shall come from the political party as that of the
Sanggunian member who caused the vacancy and shall serve the
unexpired term of the vacant office.

In the appointment herein mentioned, a nomination and a certificate of membership of the appointee from the highest official of the political party concerned are conditions *sine qua non*, and any appointment without such nomination and certification shall be null and void *ab initio* and shall be a ground for administrative action against the official responsible therefore;

- (3) In case the permanent vacancy is caused by a Sanggunian member who does not belong to any political party, the City Mayor shall, upon recommendation of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, appoint a qualified person to fill the vacancy; and
  - (4) In case of vacancy in the representation of the youth and the barangay in the Sangguniang Panlungsod, said vacancy shall be filled automatically by the official next in rank of the organization concerned.
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SEC. 26. Temporary Vacancy in the Office of the City Mayor - (a) 16 17 When the City Mayor is temporarily incapacitated to perform his or her duties for physical or legal reasons such as, but not limited to, leave of absence, 18 19 travel abroad and suspension from office, the City Vice Mayor or the highest 20 ranking Sangguniang Panlungsod member, shall automatically exercise the 21 powers and perform the duties and functions of the City Mayor, except the 22 power to appoint, suspend or dismiss employees which can only be exercised 23 if the period of temporary incapacity exceeds thirty (30) working days.

(b) Said temporary incapacity shall terminate upon submission to the
Sangguniang Panlungsod of a written declaration by the City Mayor of having
reported to office. In case where the temporary incapacity is due to legal
cause, the City Mayor shall also submit the necessary documents showing
the said legal cause no longer exists.

(c) When traveling within the country but outside the territorial
jurisdiction of the City for a period not exceeding three (3) consecutive days,
the City Mayor may designate in writing the officer-in-charge of the office.

Such authorization shall specify the powers and functions that the local
 official concerned shall exercise in the absence of the City Mayor except the
 power to appoint, suspend or dismiss employees.

(d) If the City Mayor fails or refuses to issue such authorization, the City
Vice Mayor or the highest ranking *Sangguniang Panlungsod* member, as the
case maybe, shall have the right to assume the powers, duties and functions
of the said office on the fourth (4th) day of absence of the City Mayor, subject
to the limitations provided in subsection (c) hereof.

9 (e) Except as provided above, the City Mayor shall, in no case, authorize 10 any local official to assume the powers, duties and functions of the office, 11 other than the City Vice Mayor or the highest ranking Sangguniang 12 Panlungsod member, as the case may be.

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### ARTICLE VII

# THE APPOINTIVE OFFICIALS OF THE CITY:

## THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, POWERS AND DUTIES

SEC. 27. The Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod – (a) There
shall be a secretary of the Sangguniang Panlungsod who shall be a career
official with the rank and salary equal to a head of a department or office.

resolutions, and other official acts of the Sangguniang Panlungsod
and present the same for signature of the presiding officer;

- 1 (3) Forward to the City Mayor, for approval, copies of ordinances 2 enacted by the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* duly certified by the 3 presiding officer, in the manner provided in Section 54 of the 4 Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;
  - (4) Forward to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan copies of duly approved ordinances in the manner provided in Sections 56 and 57 under Book I of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;

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- (5) Furnish, upon the request of any interested party, certified copies of records of public character in his or her custody, upon payment to the City Treasurer of such fees as may be prescribed by ordinance;
- (6) Record in a book kept for the purpose, all ordinances and
  resolutions enacted or adopted by the Sangguniang Panlungsod,
  with the dates of passage and publication thereof;
- 16 (7) Keep the office and all no confidential records therein open to the
  public during usual business hours;
- (8) Translate into the dialect used by the majority of the inhabitants
  all ordinances and resolutions immediately after their approval
  and cause the publication of the same together with the original
  version in the manner provided under the Local Government Code
  of 1991, as amended;
- (9) Take custody of the local archives and where applicable, the local
  library and annually account for the same; and
- (10) Perform other duties and functions and exercise such other
  powers as provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991,
  as amended, and those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.
- SEC. 28. The City Treasurer (a) The City Treasurer shall be
  appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Finance (DOF) from a list of

at least three (3) ranking eligible recommendees of the City Mayor, subject to
 the civil service law, rules and regulations.

3 (b) The City Treasurer shall be under the administrative supervision of
4 the City Mayor, to whom he shall report regularly on the tax collection efforts
5 of the City.

6 (c) The City Treasurer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of 7 the City of Calaca, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree in 8 commerce, public administration or law from a recognized college or 9 university, and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent and must 10 have acquired, for at least five (5) years, experience in treasury or accounting 11 service.

12 (d) The City Treasurer shall receive such compensation, emoluments
13 and allowances as may be determined by law.

(e) The City Treasurer shall take charge of the City Finance Department,and shall:

- 16 (1) Advise the City Mayor, the Sangguniang Panlungsod and other
  17 local government and national officials concerned regarding
  18 disposition of local government funds and on such other matters
  19 relative to public finance;
- 20 (2) Take custody and exercise proper management of the funds of the
  21 City;

  other funds the custody of which may be entrusted to the City
  Treasurer by law or other competent authority;
- (4) Inspect private commercial and industrial establishments within
  the jurisdiction of the City in relation to the implementation of tax

  Code of 1991, as amended;
- 29 (5) Maintain and update the tax information system of the City; and

- 1(6) Perform other duties and functions, and exercise such other2powers as provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991,3as amended, and those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

The City Assessor – (a) The City Assessor must be a citizen 6 of the Philippines, a resident of the City of Calaca, of good moral character, a 7 holder of a college degree preferably in civil or mechanical engineering, 8 commerce, or any other related course from a recognized college or university, 9 a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent and must have acquired, at 10 least five (5) years, experience in real property assessment work or in any 11 related field for immediately preceding the date of appointment.

(b) The City Assessor shall receive such compensation, emolumentsand allowances as may be determined by law.

14 (c) The City Assessor shall take charge of the City Assessor's15 Department, and shall:

- 16 (1) Ensure that all laws and policies governing the appraisal and
  17 assessment of real properties for taxation purposes are properly
  18 executed;
- 19 (2) Initiate, review and recommend changes in policies and
  20 objectives, plans and programs, techniques, procedures and
  21 practices in the evaluation and assessment of real properties for
  22 taxation purposes;
  - (3) Establish a systematic method of real property assessment;
- 24 (4) Install and maintain real property identification and accounting
  25 systems;
- (5) Prepare, install and maintain a system of tax mapping, showing
  graphically all properties subject to assessment and gather all
  data concerning the same;
- 29 (6) Conduct frequent physical surveys to verify and determine
  30 whether all real properties within the City are properly listed in
  31 the assessment rolls;

1 (7) Exercise the functions of appraisal and assessment primarily for 2 taxation purposes of all real properties in the City; (8) Prepare a schedule of the fair market value of the different 3 4 classes of real properties in accordance with the provisions of 5 the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended; б (9) Issue, upon request of any interested party, certified copies of 7 assessment records of real properties and all other records 8 relative to its assessment, upon payment of a service charge or 9 fee to the City Treasurer; 10 (10)Submit every semester a report of all assessments, as well as 11 cancellations and modifications of assessments to the City 12 Mayor and the Sangguniang Panlungsod; 13 (11)Attend personally or through an authorized representative all sessions of the Local Board of Assessment Appeals whenever the 14 15 assessment is subject of appeal, and present or submit any 16 information or record in his possession as may be required by 17 the Board; and (12)Perform such other duties and functions, and exercise such 18 19 other powers as provided under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and those that are prescribed by law or 20 21 ordinance. 22

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(b) The City Budget Officer shall receive such compensation, emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

(1) Prepare forms, orders and circulars embodying instructions on
budgetary and appropriation matters for the signature of the City

- 11(1) Formulate measures for the approval of the Sangguniang12Panlungsod and provide technical assistance and support to the13City Mayor in carrying out said measures to ensure the delivery14of basic services and provision of adequate facilities relative to15agricultural services;

3 (c) The City Business Permits and Licensing Officer shall take charge
4 of the Business Permits and Licensing Office, and shall:

- 5 (1) Supervise the conduct of spot/post inspection of all business
  6 establishments, gaming and other entities requiring permits and
  7 licenses for compliance with existing laws and ordinances;
- 8 (2) Review the application for permits and licenses and recommend
  9 its approval/disapproval to the City Mayor or his authorized
  10 representatives; and
  - (3) Exercise over-all supervision in the City Business Permits and Licensing Office.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

# THE CITY FIRE STATION SERVICE, THE CITY JAIL SERVICE, THE CITY SCHOOLS DIVISION AND THE CITY PROSECUTION SERVICE

17 SEC. 48. The City Fire Station Service – (a) There shall be 18 established in the City at least one (1) fire station with adequate personnel, 19 firefighting facilities and equipment, subject to the standards, rules and 20 regulations that may be promulgated by the Department of the Interior and 21 Local Government (DILG). The City shall provide the necessary site of the 22 station.

(b) The city fire station service shall be headed by a City Fire Marshal
whose qualifications shall be as those provided for under Republic Act No.
9263, as amended, otherwise known as the *"Bureau of Fire Protection and Bureau of Jail Management and Penology Professionalization Act of 2004"*.

(c) The City Fire Station shall be responsible for the provision of various
emergency services such as rescue and evacuation of injured people related
to fire incidents and, in general, fire prevention and suppression measures to
secure the safety of life and property of the citizenry.

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1 SEC. 49. The City Jail Service - (a) The DILG shall, at least five (5) months from the commencement of the corporate existence of the City, 2 establish and maintain a secured, clean, adequately equipped and sanitary 3 jail facility for the custody and safekeeping of prisoners, any fugitive from 4 justice, or person detained awaiting investigation or trial and/or transfer to 5 the National Penitentiary, or a violent mentally ill person who may endanger 6 oneself or the safety of others, as duly certified by the proper medical health 7 8 officer, prior to the transfer of such person to a mental institution.

(b) The City Jail Service shall be headed by a City Jail Warden whose 9 qualifications shall be as those provided for under Republic Act No. 9263, as 10 11 amended, otherwise known as the "Bureau of Fire Protection and Bureau of Jail Management and Penology Professionalization Act of 2004". 12 The Provincial Jail Warden shall assist in the immediate rehabilitation of 13 14 individuals or detention of prisoners. Great care must be exercised so that human rights of these prisoners are respected and protected, and their 15 spiritual and physical well-being are properly and promptly attended to. 16

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18 **SEC. 50.** The City Schools Division – (a) The Department of 19 Education (DepEd) shall establish and maintain a city schools division of the 20 City of Calaca whose area of jurisdiction will cover all the school districts 21 within the City; and

(b) The city school division shall be headed by a City Schools Division
Superintendent who must possess the necessary qualifications required by
the DepEd.

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SEC. 51. The City Prosecution Service – (a) The Department of Justice (DOJ) shall, within two (2) months from the commencement of the corporate existence of the City, establish and maintain a prosecution service. It shall be headed by a city prosecutor, who shall be assisted by such number of assistant prosecutors as may be necessary, and whose qualification, manner of appointment, rank salary and benefits shall be governed by existing laws covering prosecutors in the DOJ. The City Prosecution Service
 shall be organizationally part of the DOJ, and under the supervision and
 control of the Secretary of the DOJ.

(b) The City Prosecutor shall handle the criminal prosecution in the
municipal trial courts in the City as well as in the regional trial courts for
criminal cases originating in the territory of the City, and shall render to or
for the City such services as are required by law, ordinance or regulation of
the DOJ.

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SEC. 52. Succession Clause - The City of Calaca shall succeed to all
 the assets, properties, liabilities and obligations of the Municipality of Calaca.

SEC. 53. Election of Provincial Governor and Sangguniang Panlalawigan Members of the Province of Batangas – The qualified voters of the City of Calaca shall be qualified to vote and run for any elective position in the elections for provincial governor, provincial vice governor, Sangguniang Panlalawigan members and other elective offices for the Province of Batangas.

SEC. 54. Jurisdiction of the Province of Batangas - The City of
 Calaca shall, unless otherwise provided by law, continue to be under the
 jurisdiction of the Province of Batangas.

23 SEC. 55. Suspension of Increase in Rates of Local Taxes – No 24 increase in the rates of local taxes shall be imposed by the City within the 25 period of five (5) years from its acquisition of corporate existence.

SEC. 56. Legislative District - Until otherwise provided by law, the
City of Calaca shall continue to be a part of the First Legislative District of the
Province of Batangas.

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1 **SEC. 57.** *Applicability of Laws* – The provisions of the Local 2 Government Code of 1991, as amended, and such other laws as are applicable 3 to component cities shall govern the City of Calaca insofar as they are not 4 inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

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6 **SEC. 58.** Separability Clause – If, for any reason or reasons, any part 7 or provision of this charter shall be held unconstitutional, invalid or 8 inconsistent with the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, the other 9 parts or provisions hereof which are not affected shall continue to be in full 10 force and effect.

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SEC. 59. Effectivity – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
 its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2)
 newspapers of general circulation.
